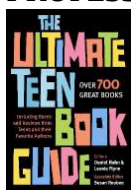

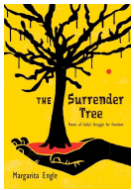

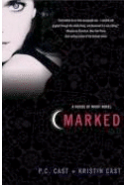
***Book of a thousand days*** / Shannon Hale. (FIC HAL)

Sixteen-year-old atheist Simone Turner-Bloom's life changes in unexpected ways when her parents convince her to make contact with her biological mother, an agnostic from a Jewish family who is losing her battle with cancer.

Teenager Zoey Redbird has been selected to enter the House of Night training school for adult vampires. As she discovers her newly granted powers, Zoey copes with the stress of leaving old friends behind and adjusting to a new school.

Thrill-seeker Skye befriends Catherine at the Esther Percy School for Girls. Skye and Catherine take increasingly dangerous risks in their youthful belief that they are indestructible.

In 1990, thirteen-year-old John "Spud" Milton, a prepubescent choirboy, keeps a diary of his first year at an elite, boys-only boarding school in South Africa, as he deals with bizarre housemates, wild crushes, and embarrassingly dysfunctional parents.

***A room on Lorelei Street*** / Mary E. Pearson. (FIC PEA)

To escape a miserable existence taking care of her alcoholic mother, seventeen-year-old Zoe rents a room from an eccentric woman, but her earnings as a waitress after school are minimal and she must go to extremes to cover expenses.

***13 little blue envelopes*** / Maureen Johnson. (FIC JOH)

When seventeen-year-old Ginny receives a packet of mysterious envelopes from her favorite aunt, she leaves New Jersey to criss-cross Europe on a sort of scavenger hunt that transforms her life.

***Stuck in neutral*** / Terry Trueman. (FIC TRU)

Fourteen-year-old Shawn McDaniel, who suffers from severe cerebral palsy and cannot function, relates his perceptions of his life, his family, and his condition, especially as he believes his father is planning to kill him.



***Saving Francesca*** / Melina Marchetta. (FIC MAR)

Sixteen-year-old Francesca could use her outspoken mother's help with the problems of being one of a handful of girls at a parochial school that has just turned co-ed, but her mother has suddenly become severely depressed.

***Memoirs of a teenage amnesiac*** / Gabrielle Zevin. (FIC ZEV)

After a nasty fall, Naomi realizes that she has no memory of the last four years and finds herself reassessing every aspect of her life.

***The patron saint of butterflies*** / Cecilia Galante. (FIC GAL)

Agnes and Honey are two friends born into Mount Blessing, a religious commune with strict rules and closely guarded secrets. Agnes wants nothing less than to become a saint, but Honey longs to get as far away from the commune as possible and live a normal life. When Agnes' grandmother, Nana Pete, takes the girls away from Mount Blessing, the commune's lies are revealed and the girls realize that they must make their own future.



***Keturah and Lord Death*** / Martine Leavitt. (FIC LEA)

When Lord Death comes to claim sixteen-year-old Keturah while she is lost in the King's Forest, she charms him with her story and is granted a twenty-four hour reprieve in which to seek her one true love.

***Airhead*** / Meg Cabot. (FIC CAB)

While attending the grand opening of a new SoHo Stark Megastore, Emerson Watts has her life thrown for a loop when a freak accident tosses her into the shows of teen supermodel Nikki Howard. Even though Emerson could never accept this new life, she realizes that it may be the one thing that could make her dreams come true.
